

2021 Mid-Year Minimum Wage Changes. This material is current as of May 28, 2021 and is subject to change.

Some states change minimum wages mid-year rather than at the beginning of the year. To assist you with planning, the following is a list of upcoming state minimum wage increases:

Reminder: Many local jurisdictions will also be increasing their minimum wage rates this year. Employees covered by federal, state, and local minimum wage laws are generally entitled to receive the highest applicable rate.
